I. Paradox of Lordship of Jesus Christ (Gk. para-"beyond" - doxa "opinion")

A. WOW!! JOY—Christ as light, life and baptizer in the Holy Spirit (Jn. 8:12)

- B. YUCK!! SORROW—Christ Experienced the Darkness of the "Suffering Servant"
 - 1. Messiah (Heb.) for "Christ" (Gk.)—anointed one, anointed with the Holy Spirit"
 - 2. Darkness of Suffering and Death—Title of Jesus, OT "Suffering Servant" (Is. 53:3-6)

C. Christian Success lies in what the world calls failure -Suffering (faithfulness)>>Condemnation (witness—martyr)>>Death (unconditional love)

II. "Messiah-ship" Defines Discipleship--

Disciple—follower, learner who attaches him/herself entirely to the Master—Christ A. We are called to be suffering servant disciples

B. We are to embrace Christ's Cross—NO CROSS, NO RESURRECTION

(2 Tm 2:11-12)

C. Christ's 3 Step Waltz — Die - Rise – Reign



- Our Waltz with Christ (3 S's) Suffering Surrender Spiritual Growth
- Process of embracing the Cross and Resurrection is a SPIRAL toward God
- Each time we go through this process, we grow closer to the love of the Trinity (Father/Son/Holy Spirit)
